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## Vocabulary Words

#### What is forest management?

It's the way we care for natural areas. It can include responsible tourism harvesting trees to manage age and density, and replanting trees. **Tourism** is when people visit new places and experience new things.

#### What is a sustainable resource?

This is something that can be replenished at the same rate or faster than it is consumed, without damaging the environment. Trees are an example of a sustainable resource.

#### What are crossties?

A crosstie is the wooden beam that lays under a railroad track to support it. On average, there are 3,250 wooden crossties throughout each mile of train track.

#### What does biodegradable mean?

An item that is biodegradable will **decompose** or break down naturally, returning to the earth without hurting the environment.

#### What is an innovator?


An innovator is someone who develops new ideas, products, or services that will have a positive impact. They may also find a new way to use an existing invention.











